Program: Randy Gragg is the Local and Regional Director of the Elks free throw contest. Randy spoke briefly about the Elks, which is a fraternal organization that began in 1868 and now has over a million members attending 1,500 lodges in the U.S. The proceeds from fundraisers go to charitable activities, in fact the Elks organized the first Veterans Hospital in the U.S. for veterans returning from WW I. The Elks later turned over the hospital to the U.S. Government, which is how the Veterans Administration began. The free throw contest is for boys and girls within

the ages of 8 - 13. Over 3.5 million kids participate, with 97% of the lodges participating. It is a no expense contest, with no registration fees.
