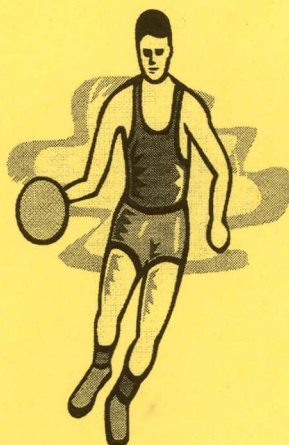
Our Board meeting will be held at 5:30 tonight. We will discuss future Christmas tree sales and a possible pancake feed in June.
