The state is broken into 6 districts with a total of 2,000 employees. One of KDOT’s priorities is safety with distracted driving the primary cause of increasing fatalities nationwide and in Kansas also.

KDOT manages all features of the state’s transportation: aviation, rail, transit and roads. Kansas is ranked 4th nationally in the number of road miles because we are unique with roads every square mile.

The current gasoline taxes for roads is 25 cents/gallon for Kansas and another 25 cents/gallon for federal. KDOT partners with the Kansas Turnpike Authority by state law. Both are separate entities and no funding is exchanged.
