We have 300 trees coming for the two lots.

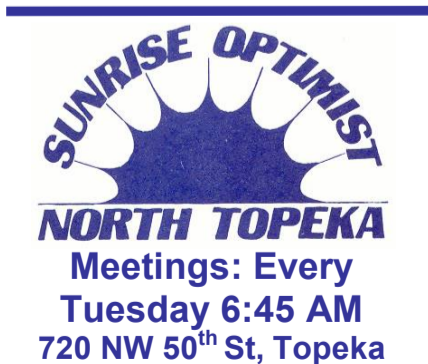
This is a very busy season for us, so please schedule some time to volunteer! We do a lot of great things here, and it is great to see the smiles on a child's face all year long.
